STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of repairing roadway leading from town
of Greenville to Lily Bay Bridge, in county of Piscataquis.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) to aid in repairing a
3 roadway leading from the northerly terminus of Main
4 street in the town of Greenville, county of Piscataquis,
5 through Gore A 2 to Lily Bay bridge in said county: said
6 appropriation to be expended upon that portion of said
7 highway which is between Lily Bay bridge and Greenville
8 town line, under the supervision of the State Highway
9 Department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The fact that Moosehead lake is closed to navigation for about six months of each year makes it necessary that a suitable highway be maintained between the points named in the resolve. The present road is not in a condition to be travelled in safety, and the repair of same is of the greatest importance to the general business, lumber and sporting interest of the State.
