STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter 194 of the Public Laws of 1909 and Chapter 156 of the Public Laws of 1911, relating to fire escapes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. Section 38 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Stat-2 utes, as amended by Chapter 194 of the Public Laws of 1909
3 and Chapter 156 of the Public Laws of 1911 is hereby
4 amended by striking out the word "Public" in the fourth
5 line so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 38. Every public house where guests are lodged, 7 and every building in which any trade, manufacture or busi-

8 ness is carried on, requiring the presence of workmen above 9 the first story, and all rooms used for assembly or amuse-10 ment, and all tenement houses three stories in height where 11 only one stairway or means of egress from the upper stories 12 of the building is provided, and all tenement houses of four 13 or more stories in height, intended to be occupied by fam-14 ilies, boarders or lodgers, above the third story, and all 15 school houses two stories or more in height, shall at all times 16 be provided with proper egresses or other means of escape 17 from fire sufficient for the use of all persons accommodated, 18 assembled, employed, lodged or resident therein. These 19 egresses and means of escape shall be kept unobstructed, in 20 good repair and ready for use, the sufficiency thereof to be 21 determined as provided in the following section.'
