STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Charles Fogg of Norway.

Resolved, That there be paid to Charles Fogg of Norway

- 2 eight dollars per month, payable quarterly from the State
- 3 Pension fund for soldiers to begin January 1, 1913, and
- 4 continuing during the pleasure of the Legislature and until
- 5 otherwise ordered.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Charles Fogg enlisted in the service of the United States from Oxford December, 1864, for one year. He was mustered into service as a private and was honorably discharged in May, 1865. In April, 1865, he was attacked with measles, from the effects of which he has never recovered. He is now totally disabled from the performance of labor and is unable to earn a living. He suffers from bronchitis, deafness, rheumatism, also stomach and liver troubles. He has made application for a United States pension but as it happened so many of his company who knew about his case had died, that he was unable to prove his claim. He never has received a United States pension.
