## STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to incorporate Connor Plantation.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives assembled:

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Township Letter "K", Range two, west from the east line
2 of the State of Maine in the County of Aroostook and known
3 as Connor Plantation, is hereby incorporated as a town un4 der the name of Connor; and the inhabitants thereof are
5 hereby invested with all the powers and privileges and sub6 ject to the duties and liabilities incident to other towns in
7 this state.

The collectors of the plantation of Connor shall have power 9 to finish the collection of all taxes which have been com-

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10 mitted to them for collection prior to the passage of this 11 act, and to settle with and to pay the same to the treasurer 12 of the town of Connor, and the several officers of said plan-13 tation are empowered to perform the duties of town officers 14 in the town created by this act, until their successors shall 15 have been chosen and qualified as town officers of the Con-16 nor under this act.

Any Justice of the Peace may call the first meeting of the 18 town of Connor by posting a warrant therefor, stating the 19 object of said meeting, in three public and conspicuous places 20 in said town at least seven days before the time of holding 21 said meeting.

All property now belonging to Connor plantation shall be-23 long to, and the title thereof is hereby vested in the town of 24 Connor.

The persons hereafter becoming chargeable as paupers 26 within the limits of said town shall be chargeable to said 27 town of Connor, excepting those who are now state paupers.
