STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of a highway Bridge in the Plantation of
New Canada.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) to aid in the construc-
3 tion of a bridge across Perley brook, so-called, on the road
4 leading from Fort Kent to Caribou, in the plantation of New
5 Canada, provided there be appropriated by the plantation
6 of New Canada, or otherwise, the sum of five hundred dol-
7 lars (\$500) for the same purpose: both sums to be expend-
8 ed under the supervision of the State Highway Department.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This bridge is on the main road leading from the town of Fort Kent to Stockholm, New Sweden and Caribou and is now a corduroy bridge, very rough and dangerous to cross with automobiles. The plantation has many miles of road to keep in repair and has many new roads to build to accommodate new settlers that have commenced to clear and improve new farms and this appropriation would enable the plantation to put the Caribou Road in good repair through this plantation.
