STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of John R. Dinsmore of Kittery.

Resolved, That there be paid John R. Dinsmore of Kittery
2 the sum of eight dollars per month payable quarterly from
3 the fund appropriated for Military Pensions to begin Jan-
4 uary first, 1913.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

John R. Dinsmore of Kittery enlisted in the service for the First Maine Regiment of the State in Captain M. F. Wentworth's Company, under the first call of volunteers, in April, 1861, and was sent with this company to Garrison, Fort McCleary, where he served three months, but was never mustered into the United States' service, consequently cannot obtain a pension in any other manner, except by an act of the Legislature. Mr. Dinsmore is about seventy-five years of age, unable to perform any manual labor, and the pension asked for under this resolve may prevent him from becoming an object of charity.
