STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of aid in building a bridge across Moose River near its mouth.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum 2 of four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to aid in building a bridge 3 across Moose River near its mouth, in the township of Rock-4 wood, provided that the Great Northern Paper Company 5 shall appropriate four thousand dollars (\$4,000) for the 6 same purpose; the location of said bridge shall be determined 7 by, and the expenditure of both sums of money shall be un-8 der the supervision of, the State Highway Department.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The building of this bridge would convenience a large community living on the northwest side of Moose River, and which is financially unable to assume the expense. The Great Northern Paper Company has spent large sums in building roads in that vicinity which are used by the public and is willing to aid in the erection of this bridge to the amount named in the resolve.
