STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of James R. Hunton of Milford.

Resolved, That there be paid to James R. Hunton a pension
2 of eight dollars per month, beginning with the first day of
3 January, nineteen hundred and thirteen, and continuing dur-
4 ing the pleasure of the Legislature, and until otherwise or-
5 dered.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

James R. Hunton of Milford, in the county of Penobscot, served in the Civil War in the 12th Maine Infantry. He is seventy-six years of age. He served from the time of his enlistment until discharged from the service. On account of the ninety days clause he is unable to obtain a United States pension under the general law. He is in very poor health, and is advised by the physician that he refrain from manual labor so far as possible. He has been a resident of the State of Maine continuously from the close of the Civil War until the present time. He has no relatives of sufficient financial ability to aid him to any appreciable extent.
