STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in aid of navigation on Rangeley Lake, Moose-lucmeguntic Lake and Cupsuptic Lake.

Resolved, That the sum of four hundred dollars is hereby
2 appropriated for removing obstructions and for placing
3 buoys in Rangeley lake, Mooselucmeguntic lake and Cup-
4 suptic lake and for the erection of lights in Rangeley lake,
5 Mooselucmeguntic lake and Cupsuptic lake and the main-
6 tenance of the same for the year nineteen hundred and
7 thirteen and a like sum for the year nineteen hundred and
8 fourteen. Said buoys and lights shall be placed at such
9 points in said lakes as will best serve the needs of navi-
10 gation thereon. All said moneys shall be expended under

11 the direction of state steamboat inspectors. Any part of
12 the money hereby appropriated for removing obstructions,
13 for the placing of buoys and lights and maintenance of lights
14 which shall be unexpended at the end of the year nineteen
15 hundred and fourteen shall revert to the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Rangeley Lake now has 18 buoys and 3 lights, and about 6 additional buoys are now needed.

Practically all of the buoys on this lake have to be reset and painted after the ice goes out each year and several have to be replaced.

A considerable amount of work needs to be done in clearing hidden logs out of the channel each year.
