STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter forty-one of the
Public Laws of 1903, relating to the duties of the Commis-
sioner of Sea and Shore Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. Section one of chapter forty-one of the Public
2 Laws of 1903, is hereby amended by adding to said section
3 the following :

'He shall keep a record of all prosecutions in violation of
5 this chapter; the names of persons or firm prosecuted, the
6 fines imposed and collected in each case, and the final dis-
7 position of the same, and submit the same in report to the

8 governor;’ so that said section as amended shall read as
9 follows:

‘Section 1. The governor, with the advice and consent of
11 the council, shall appoint a commissioner who shall have
12 general supervision of the sea and shore fisheries and shell
13 fish regulated by this chapter and shall hold his office for
14 three years and until his successor is appointed and quali-
15 fied. He shall exercise supervision over all the fisheries
16 and their products taken from tide waters within the state,
17 including the proper enforcement of all laws relating to
18 catching, packing, curing, manufacturing, branding and
19 transportation of all kinds of pickled, salt, smoked, fresh,
20 canned, frozen shell or other fish. He shall make a de-
21 tailed biennial report in the month of December, showing
22 the amount of capital invested, number of men employed in,
23 value of products of, and any other information that he
24 may be able to obtain relating to the sea and shore fisheries.
25 He shall keep a record of all prosecutions in violation of
26 this chapter; the names of persons or firms prosecuted, the
27 fines imposed and collected in each case, and the final dis-
28 position of the same, and submit the same in report to the
29 governor.’
