STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT relating to The Jerguson Manufacturing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The corporate purposes of The Jerguson Man-
2 ufacturing Company, a corporation organized under the
3 general laws of the State of Maine, in Kittery, in said state,
4 on July 30th, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and
5 six, which in the original certificate of organization read as
6 follows, to wit:

“To carry on a foundry and general machine shop,” are
8 hereby amended, so that as amended they shall read as
9 follows:

‘To conduct and manage a foundry and general machine
11 shop, with all the business incidental thereto, and to carry
12 on the business of manufacturing and selling engines,
13 boilers, steam and water gauges, machinery and machinery
14 fittings and accessories of all kinds, and of buying, selling
15 and dealing in metals, glass and all articles necessary and
16 incidental to such business.

Also to buy, sell and deal in all other kinds of property,
18 both real and personal, incidental or beneficial to such busi-
19 ness.

Also to buy, sell and deal in stocks, bonds and rights of
21 other corporations organized for similar purposes, and take
22 out letters patent in its own name, and purchase patent
23 rights, licenses and rights under patents owned by others,
24 and make all necessary contracts connected with and inci-
25 dental to all of the above purposes.’

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
