STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section 1 of Chapter 313 of Private and Special Laws of 1864, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Baskahegan Dam Co.," as amended by Chapter 272 of he Private and Special Laws of 1903, and by Chapter 147 of the Private and Special Laws of 1911.

Be it enacted by the Pcople of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter three hundred thirteen of the Pri-

- 3 entitled "An Act to incorporate the Baskahegan Dam Com-
- 4 pany," as amended by chapter two hundred seventy-two of
- 5 the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three
- 6 and by chapter one hundred forty-seven of the Private and

7 Special Laws of nineteen hundred and eleven, is hereby 8-further amended by adding thereto the following:

'And the person, company, or corporation driving said to drive shall be liable to said Baskahegan Dam Company for all damages, cost, or expense which the said Baskahegan Dam Company may incur by the discharge of its stored water,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 1. John Pomeroy of Bancroft, James S. Hamilton 16 of Orono, Joseph D. Smith of Veazie and Davis R. Stock-17 well, Joab W. Palmer, Benjamin Johnson, Walter Brown, 18 Isaiah Stetson, George Stetson, William H. McCrillis, and 19 Thomas W. Baldwin of Bangor, their associates, successors 20 and assigns are hereby created a body corporate under the 21 name of the Baskahegan Dam Company with all the gen-22 eral powers, rights, and duties of other corporations under 23 the laws of this state, for the purpose of erecting and main-24 taining a dam at Baskahegan Falls near the mouth of Bas-25 kahegan stream in Bancroft in the county of Aroostook, 26 and another dam at the outlet of Baskahegan lake in town-27 ship number nine, range three, in the county of Washing-28 ton, both for the purpose of facilitating the driving of logs 29 and lumber out of said Baskahegan stream, and when nec-30 essary all the water stored in said dams shall be used for 31 the purpose of driving logs, and said company shall have 32 the rights to store water in both of said dams for the pur-33 pose of manufacturing, generating electricity, or for any

34 other power or may use or make contracts for the sale of 35 said stored water with any corporations or persons for the 36 purposes aforesaid, and receive payment therefor, said com-37 pany may also make improvements in the navigation of the 38 Baskahegan stream. Whenever any main drive on the Mat-39 tawamkeag river below the mouth of the Baskahegan stream 40 shall be in need of water for driving purposes, after one 41 day's notice in writing to said dam company or its agent, 42 the person or corporation driving such Mattawamkeag drive 43 may take and use all water stored by said dam company's 44 dams, when not necessary for driving purposes on the said 45 Baskahegan stream, and shall pay therefor the sum of twen-46 ty dollars for each twenty-four hours taking and using said 47 stored water, the same to be a lien on the logs or lumber 48 of said drive to be enforced by attachment, said lien to con-49 tinue for ninety days after such logs or lumber have reached 50 their destination. And the person, company, or corporation 51 driving said drive shall be liable to said Baskahegan Dam 52 Company for all damages, cost, or expense which the said 53 Baskahegan Dam Company may incur by the discharge of 54 its stored water.'
