STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of unpaid bills on the Van Buren Bridge.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the

- 2 sum of two thousand two hundred sixteen dollars and
- 3 twenty-five cents (\$2216.25) for the purpose of completing
- 4 the payments due on account of the construction of the
- 5 bridge across the St. John River between the town of Van
- 6 Buren, Maine, and the town of St. Leonards, New Bruns-
- 7 wick; said appropriation to be expended by the State High-
- 8 way Department.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Amount due the Penn Bridge Company	\$818 44
Amount due the Canadian Inspection Company,	389 91
Amount due E. E. Greenwood	75 00
Amount due the citizens of Van Buren	932 90

Total \$2,216 25

The amount due the Penn Bridge Company is for balance for contract on the superstructure of the Van Buren bridge, in accordance with the report of the highway department for 1911. The amount due the Canadian Inspection Company, three hundred and eighty-nine dollars and ninety-one cents (\$381.91) is for the inspection of steel in the bridge.

The amount due E. E. Greenwood, seventy-five dollars (\$75.00), is the balance on account of engineering services.

The amount due the citizens of Van Buren was for the cost of the fill of the approach on the Van Buren side of the river; funds not being available by the State for the work at that time, the additional one hundred and thirty-two dollars and ninety cents (\$132.90) is for interest on loan made by the citizens of Van Buren for four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) and placed to the credit of the highway department in 1910 for prosecuting the work on the Van Buren bridge. Funds from the State not being available at that time.
