STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to extend and amend the charter of the Brewer
Water Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. All the rights, powers and privileges of the
2 Brewer Water Company, which were granted by chapter
3 three hundred and nine, of the private and special laws of
4 one thousand nine hundred and nine, are hereby extended
5 for two years from the twenty-fourth day of March, one
6 thousand nine hundred and thirteen; and the persons named
7 in said act, their associates, successors and assigns, shall
8 have all the rights, powers and privileges that were granted
9 them by said act; to be exercised in the same manner and
10 for the same purpose as specified in said act.

Sect. 2. Amend section one of said chapter three hundred
2 and nine by inserting after the word "Holden" the words
3 Bradley and Hampden,' so that said section as amended
4 shall read as follows:

'Section 1. Leon F. Higgins, Charles A. Harlow, William
6 B. Snow, Frank A. Floyd, Albert G. Dole, John E. Little-
7 field, Albert A. Kenney, Frank H. Nickerson, Calvin P.
8 Thomas, George W. Patten, Edward B. Burr, Charles H.
9 Small, Lyman B. Currier and George H. Reed, their asso-
10 ciates, successors and assigns, are hereby made a corpora-
11 tion by the name of Brewer Water Company, for the pur-
12 pose of supplying the inhabitants of Brewer and the towns
13 of Veazie, Orrington, Eddington, Holden, Bradley and
14 Hampden, and all said municipalities with pure water for
15 domestic, sanitary, and municipal purposes.'
