RESOLVE in favor of aid in repairing highway in Town of  
Grafton.

*Resolved,* That there be and hereby is appropriated the  
2 sum of two thousand dollars (\$2000), one thousand dollars  
3 (\$1000) in the year 1913 and one thousand dollars (\$1000)  
4 in the year 1914, for the repair and permanent improvement  
5 of the highway leading through Grafton Notch, so called,  
6 in the town of Grafton; said appropriation to be expended  
7 under the supervision of the State Highway Department.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This piece of road is a part of the direct travelled route between Bethel and Errol, New Hampshire. It accommodates not only the people of Errol, Upton and Grafton, but the tourists travelling from the White Mountains. The stage line from Errol, N. H., to Bethel, Me., travels over this road, as does all the freight to Grafton, Upton and Errol. There is about four miles of this road in Grafton for which the appropriation is asked. This road is very hilly and is composed of clay and loam, which renders it almost impassable during the rainy season. The town of Grafton is not able financially to rebuild this road without assistance from the state.
