STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Maine providing for the election on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November biennially of Governors, Senators, Representatives and other officers now required to be elected on the second Monday of September biennially.

Resolved, That the following amendment to the Consti-2 tution of the State be proposed for the action of the legal 3 voters of the state in the manner provided by the Consti-4 tution, to wit:

Article II. Section four is hereby amended as follows, 6 namely, by striking out the words "second Monday of Sep-7 tember" in the second, and tenth and eleventh lines of said 8 section, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "Tuesday 9 next after the first Monday in November."

Article VI. Section seven is hereby amended by striking 11 out the words "second Monday of September" in the third 12 line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the words 'On 13 Tuesday next after the first Monday in November.'

Article IX. Section ten is hereby amended by striking 15 out the words "second Monday of September" in the sec16 ond and third lines and inserting in lieu thereof the words 17 "Tuesday next after the first Monday in November," and 18 section twelve of said article is hereby amended by striking 19 out the words "second Monday in September" in the ninth 20 line and inserting in lieu thereof the words "Tuesday next 21 after the first Monday in November."

Resolved, That all the foregoing is proposed to be voted 23 on as one amendment and not as two or more several amend-24 ments.

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities, the selectmen of towns and the assessors of plantations in this state are herezo by empowered and directed to notify the inhabitants of their serepective cities, towns and plantations in the manner prescribed by law at the meeting in September in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten to vote upon the amendament proposed in the foregoing resolutions, and the questions shall be, "Shall the Constitution be amended as prospected by a resolution of the Legislature providing for the holding of the election on the Tuesday next after the first Monday in November biennially of Governors, Senators, and Representatives and other officers now required to be

37 elected on the second Monday in September biennially?"
38 and the inhabitants of said cities, towns and plantations shall
39 vote by ballot on said questions, those favoring the amend40 ment voting "Yes" and those opposing it voting "No" upon
41 their ballots; and the ballots shall be received, sorted, count42 ed and declared in open ward, town and plantation meet43 ings and lists of the votes so received shall be made and
44 returned to the office of the secretary of state in the same
45 manner as votes for Governor and members of the Legis46 lature, and the Governor and Council shall count the same
47 and make return to the next Legislature and if it shall ap48 pear that a majority of the votes are in favor of the amend49 ment, the Constitution shall be amended accordingly.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall prepare and 51 furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations, ballots 52 and blanks for returns in conformity to the foregoing re-53 solves accompanied by a copy thereof.
