STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Monmouth Academy.

Resolved, That there be appropriated for the use of the
2 trustees of Monmouth Academy the sum of fifteen hundred
3 dollars for the year nineteen hundred and thirteen and the
4 sum of fifteen hundred dollars for the year nineteen hun-
5 dred and fourteen for the purpose of repairing and remod-
6 eling the present school building and enlarging same and
7 installing a heating plant.

STATEMENT OF FACTS TO ACCOMPANY RE-
SOLVE IN FAVOR OF MONMOUTH ACADEMY.

Monmouth Academy is one of the oldest institutions in the State, the first building having been erected in 1803. Among its alumni will be found the names of a United States senator, several representatives to Congress, state governors, a major general of the United States Army, judge of the Supreme Court, and a host of leading professional men. The present brick building, with wooden addition for recitation rooms, etc., was erected in 1855. A number of years ago a wooden addition was completed for use as a chemical laboratory and for manual training purposes. The school has grown rapidly in the past few years and the number of pupils who desired to attend last year was greater than could be accommodated so that some had to be turned away. The permanent funds of the institution have never been very large, so that the trustees have been unable to make extensive repairs and there is a great need at the present time of an addition to the building so that it can accommodate the pupils who desire to attend, as well as of a thorough remodeling of the present buildings to put them in comfortable modern condition. There is also need of a modern steam heating plant for the comfort of the pupils. A competent architect has estimated that to make the necessary additions and repairs and establish the steam heating plant will cost at least \$10,000.
