STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Lizzie Bean.

*Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated three
2 hundred (\$300.00) dollars per annum for the years nine-
3 teen hundred and thirteen and nineteen hundred and four-
4 teen. The said money to be paid Lizzie Bean of Passa-
5 dumkeag in quarterly payments of seventy-five (\$75) dol-
6 lars each, under the supervision of the governor and council.*

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Maurice Bean of Passadumkeag, a constable in the performance of his duty, on Saturday morning, January 18, 1913, while performing his duty as a public official of the State of Maine in attempting to arrest one Edward Duplissis was instantly killed by said Duplissis, whom he was attempting to place under arrest.

Bean had been serving in this capacity as constable for about three years. He leaves a wife, one child, Dudley Franklin Bean, two years of age, and an unborn child.

Unless assistance is rendered this woman they will be destitute and dependent upon the assistance of charity.
