STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Lucinda P. Brackett.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the State treasury to
2 Lucinda P. Brackett of Portland in the county of Cumber-
3 land, widow of John O. Brackett, ninety (\$90.00) dollars,
4 being first two months state pay due John O. Brackett with
5 interest for fifty-two (52) years. John Brackett was a
6 private in Company K, 1st Maine Volunteers enlisting for
7 the Civil War in 1861.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

John O. Brackett enlisted at Auburn, Maine, in 1861. That his name by mistake is on the state records as John D. Brackett. That he did not receive the first two months' state pay for his service, and his said widow Lucinda P. Brackett has never received it. Enclosed herewith is notice from Captain Osgood his company commander to appear for duty, said notice being addressed to John O. Brackett. Also enclosed herewith are three affidavits relative to same.
