STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to regulate the size of smoked herring boxes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation engaged in the state in the buying, selling and packing of smoked herring to sell or offer for sale smoked herring in boxes less than the following dimensions, viz: two inches in depth, six inches in width, inside measure, and twelve inches in length, outside measure.

Sect. 2. Whoever packs, sells or offers for sale, smoked herring in boxes in violation of this act, shall forfeit twenty-five cents for each box so packed, sold or offered for sale, to be recovered by complaint.

Sect. 3. This act does not apply to boneless herring boxes.
