RESOLVE in favor of paying certain bills contracted for placing a rail in the rear of the House of Representatives, and marking the members' desks.

---

*Resolved,* That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and  
2 directed to pay to Tracey and Metcalf, of Augusta, the sum  
3 of two hundred and forty-eight dollars and forty-six cents  
4 (\$248.46), that being the amount of their bill for making  
5 and setting up the rail in Representative Hall at the rear  
6 of the members' seats; also to pay to W. S. Ladd, of Au-  
7 gusta, the sum of ten dollars and eighty-one cents (\$10.81),  
8 and the Brooks Hardware Company, of Augusta, the sum

9 of nine dollars and ten cents (\$9.10); these being the  
10 amounts of their several bills for supplies furnished to the  
11 state.

And the State Treasurer is hereby directed to charge the  
13 amounts of said bills to the general legislative expense ac-  
14 count, and to file a copy of this resolve with the Committee  
15 on Appropriations and Financial Affairs.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

On Jan. 1, 1913, the House of Representatives passed an order authorizing the Superintendent of Buildings to cause to be made and set up a rail in Representative Hall at the rear of the seats of the members. This work was done by Tracey & Metcalf, of Augusta. Their bill is \$248.46, the first item in the resolve.

On Jan. 16, 1913, the House passed the orders authorizing the marking of the desks of the members. The second item, or W. S. Ladd's bill of \$10.81, is the amount of bill for printing cards for plate holders. The third and last item is the bill of Brooks Hardware Company for \$9.10, for furnishing the plate holders.
