STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend section eight of chapter three hundred and
twenty-five of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hun-
dred and ninety-seven, entitled "An Act establishing a Munic-
ipal Court in the city of Waterville."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section eight of chapter three hundred and
2 twenty-five of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen
3 hundred and ninety-seven is hereby amended by striking out
4 the last sentence from said section and inserting in the place
5 thereof: "The recorder shall receive from said city, in

6 monthly payments, an annual salary of \$400, which shall
7 be in full for all fees pertaining to his office.' So that said
8 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 8. There shall be appointed by the governor, for
10 said court, a recorder, who shall keep the records of said
11 court when requested so to do by the judge; and in case of
12 absence from the court room, or sickness of the judge, or
13 when the office of judge shall be vacant, the recorder shall
14 have and exercise all the powers of the judge, and perform
15 all the duties required of said judge by this act, and shall
16 be empowered to sign and issue all processes and papers,
17 and to do all acts as fully and with the same effect as the
18 judge could do were he acting in the premises; and the sig-
19 nature of the recorder, as such, shall be sufficient evidence
20 of his right to act instead of the judge. The recorder shall
21 receive from said city, in monthly payments, an annual
22 salary of \$400, which shall be in full for all fees pertaining
23 to his office.'
