## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section fourteen of Chapter one hundred twenty-eight of the Revised Statutes relating to Malicious Mischiefs and Trespasses on Property.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section T. Section fourteen of chapter one hundred twen-2 ty-eight of the revised statutes is hereby amended by in-3 serting the words 'improved blueberry ground' after the . 4 word "ground" in the third line, by striking out the word 5 "twenty" and substituting therefor the words 'one hundred' 6 in the fifth line, by striking out the word "thirty" and sub-7 stituting the word 'ninety' in the sixth line of said section, 8 so that said section, when amended ,shall read as follows:

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'Sect. 14. Whoever wilfully commits any trespass, or 10 knowingly authorizes or employs another to do so, by en-11 tering the garden, orchard, pasture, cranberry ground, im-12 proved blueberry ground or improved land, of another, with 13 intent to take, carry away, destroy or injure trees, shrubs, 14 grain, grass, hay, fruit, vegetables, turf or soil thereon, 15 shall be punished by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars 16 and imprisonment for not more than ninety days.'

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
