STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section thirty-six of Chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes as amended in relation to the accurate keeping of school records and accounts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirty-six of chapter fifteen of the Re-

- 2 vised Statutes, as amended by chapter forty-eight of the
- 3 Public Laws of nineteen hundred five is hereby further
- 4 amended by inserting after the word "committee" in the
- 5 second line thereof the following: 'he shall keep a perma-
- 6 nent record of all its votes, orders and proceedings, he shall
- 7 place all orders for materials and supplies purchased by vote
- 8 of the committee and shall be its agent in keeping all finan-

o cial records and accounts. He shall issue vouchers showing the correctness of bills contracted on account of school
appropriations, but such bills shall not be allowed for payment by the municipal officers of towns unless they shall
have been approved by a majority of the members of the
superintending school committee', and by striking out the
word "and" in the third line thereof and substituting in
place thereof the word 'he', so that said section when amendof ed shall read as follows:

'Sect. 36. The superintendent of schools in every town shall be, ex-officio, secretary of the superintending school committee. He shall keep a permanent record of all its votes, orders and proceedings, he shall place all orders for materials and supplies purchased by vote of the committee and shall be its agent in keeping all financial records and accounts. He shall issue vouchers showing the correctness of bills contracted on account of school appropriations, but such bills shall not be allowed for payment by the municipal officers of towns unless they shall have been approved by a majority of the members of the superintending school committee. He shall perform such duties not herein enumerated so as said committee shall direct.'
