STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of screening Allen Pond, in Greene, in the County of Androscoggin.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars
2 be and is hereby appropriated for the year nineteen hun-
3 dred and thirteen for the purpose of screening Allen pond,
4 in Greene, to be expended under the direction of the com-
5 missioners of inland fisheries and game, when the balance
6 necessary to erect said screen, as found by said commis-
7 sioners, shall have been raised by the citizens of Andros-
8 coggin county, and paid to the treasurer of state for this
9 purpose.

Provided, further, that this appropriation shall not be avail-
11 able until the town of Greene shall have, in legal town meet-
12 ing, and having an article in the warrant for said town

13 meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, voted to as-
14 sume all liability for the keeping of said screen in repair
15 and at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so
16 that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free
17 running of the water through the same.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This resolve is asked for in order to preserve the fishing in Allen pond. At the present time many fish are lost to the lake on account of going down the outlet. And the residents of Greene are ready to unite in an effort to improve the fishing in this pond by planting fry therein, and by promoting a strong sentiment in favor of better preservation of fish in said pond, A screen at the outlet is absolutely necessary for the success of these efforts.
