IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AMENDMENT "D" TO SENATE DOCUMENT NO. 453.

Amend Section 2 of said bill by striking out the words 2 "seven years" in the ninth line thereof and substituting 3 therefor the words 'until the first Wednesday of January, A. 4 D. 1919, or until his successor shall have been chosen and 5 qualified,' also by striking out the words "five years" and 6 "three years" in the tenth line of said section and substitut-7 ing therefor the words 'until the first Wednesday of Jan-8 uary, A. D. 1917 or until his successor shall have been chosen 9 and qualified and until the first Wednesday of January, A. 10 D. 1915 or until his successor shall have been chosen and 11 qualified." Also by striking out the words in the 12th, 13th

and 14th lines of said section "Each member thereafter appointed shall hold office for seven years," and inserting the following: 'After the appointment by the Governor of the first commission, its members shall be elected by popular vote in the following manner: at each regular state election one member of the commission shall be chosen by plurality to vote. The nomination and election of such commissioner shall be governed by the same laws which govern the nomination and election of the governor and state auditor. The term of office of each commissioner so elected shall be six years beginning on the first Wednesday of January immediately following the date of such state election.'
