IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section 3 of Chapter 229 of the Public Laws  
of 1909, relating to the State Board of Arbitration and Con-  
ciliation.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section 3 of Chapter 229 of the Public Laws  
2 of 1909, is hereby amended by striking out in the second  
3 line the word "three", and inserting in place thereof the  
4 word 'five', and by striking out in the tenth line the words  
5 "annual report of the Bureau of Industrial and Labor Sta-  
6 tistics", and inserting in place thereof the words 'biennial  
7 report of the Department of Labor and Industry', so that  
8 said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 3. The members of the board shall receive a com-  
10 pensation of five dollars per diem for the time actually  
11 employed and shall receive traveling and all other necessary  
12 expenses. Each member before entering upon the per-  
13 formance of his duties shall be sworn to the faithful per-  
14 formance thereof. The board shall from time to time make  
15 such rules of procedure as it deems necessary and shall an-  
16 nually, on or before the first day of December, make a re-  
17 port to the governor and council, which shall be incorpo-  
18 rated in and printed with the biennial report of the Depart-  
19 ment of Labor and Industry. The board shall hold a meet-  
20 ing on the third Wednesday of September in each year and  
21 shall organize by choosing a chairman and secretary, both  
22 of whom shall be members of the board. Provided, the  
23 first meeting shall be held as soon as convenient after all  
24 the members have been appointed.’
