STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Maine Anti-Tuberculosis Association,
Waterville.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of one thousand dollars to be paid to the Maine Anti-
3 Tuberculosis Association, at Waterville, for the year nine-
4 teen hundred and thirteen and one thousand five hundred
5 dollars for the year nineteen hundred and fourteen, for
6 maintenance.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Maine Anti-Tuberculosis Association was organized for the purpose of educating the citizens of Maine up to the dangers of tuberculosis, to prevent its spread by means of wise legislature, by organized anti-tuberculosis associations, conducting free dispensaries and employing district nurses, by frequent lectures and by the distribution of anti-tuberculosis literature.

The association employs an executive secretary at a salary, who is giving his time to this work, and the results achieved have been very satisfactory. For the past year \$5,000 has been collected by subscriptions, but the need of work is so great, that a larger sum of money will be needed for the next year.
