STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Maine Home for Friendless Boys,
Portland.

*Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of fifteen hundred dollars to be paid to the Maine Home for
3 Friendless Boys, Portland, for the year nineteen hundred
4 and thirteen, and the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for the
5 year nineteen hundred and fourteen, for maintenance.*

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Maine Home for Friendless Boys is located at Portland. The object of the Home, to receive and care for homeless and friendless boys, and find suitable permanent homes for them. While at the Home the boys receive as much of home life as possible and attend the public schools regularly. The attendance varies from 20 to 25 boys. The State aid asked for is less than \$100 per year per boy. The balance of the expense is raised annually by friends of the Home. Our motto is "Save the boys for good citizenship."
