STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Bangor Anti-Tuberculosis Association, Bangor.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of one thousand dollars to be paid to the Bangor Anti-3 Tuberculosis Association, Bangor, for the year nineteen hun-4 dred and thirteen, and one thousand dollars for the year 5 nineteen hundred and fourteen, for maintenance.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

An Association organized in April, 1909, with its object the relief and control of tuberculosis.

A free dispensary clinic started with a doctor and nurse in attendance.

Nurse giving her entire time to care and instruction of patients and their families.

Society through its officers and committees conducting a campaign of education.

Medicine, milk and eggs and bedding furnished to needy patients.

Number of patients on nurse's visiting list at present 80.

Expense of conducting this branch of the work \$1500.00 per annum.

Camp (small sanatorium) started 1912.

Accommodations for twelve patients.

Average number of patients, six.

Number of patients at present, seven.

Total number of patients received at camp, twenty-two.

Twelve patients from Bangor; 10 from other towns.

36% paying board at \$5.00 per week.

Total cost per week of maintaining patients, including everything, \$10.00 per week per patient.

Estimated expense per annum of running Association and maintaining twelve patients at camp, \$7740.00.

Estimated income from these patients, \$1023.00.

Balance to be met by Association per annum, \$6717.00.

Sum asked from the State, \$2000.00 per annum.
