AMENDMENT A TO SENATE DOCUMENT 552.

---

Amend section 3 of Senate Document 552 by striking out  
2 all of said section after the words "laws" in the seventh  
3 line, so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

4 'Sect. 3. Such license shall terminate with the calendar  
5 year in which issued, and shall only authorize the hunting  
6 of birds and wild animals in accordance with the laws of  
7 the state, and shall not be transferable, and shall be shown  
8 by the holder thereof when upon the wild lands aforesaid,  
9 upon request, to any person authorized to enforce the in-  
10 land fish and game laws.'

Amend section 4 of Senate Document 552 by striking out  
12 the last four words in the third line of said section, all of  
13 the fourth and fifth lines and the first seven words in the

14 sixth line, and the seventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth  
15 lines of said section, so that said section, as amended, shall  
16 read as follows:

‘Sect. 4. Whoever hunts on wild lands as aforesaid with-  
18 out first procuring a license as herein provided, shall pay  
19 a fine of twenty-five dollars and costs for each offense, and  
20 every person licensed as herein provided shall, on a blank  
21 furnished him by said commissioners, make a return, as  
22 called for on said blank, of the kind and number of birds  
23 and wild animals killed by him by virtue of such license,  
24 and where killed as near as he can, and forward the same  
25 to said commissioners on or before the twentieth day of  
26 December of each year in which said license is issued.

‘Provided, however, that an actual bona fide resident of  
28 any organized plantation may hunt therein in accordance  
29 with the general law of the state without procuring a  
30 license.’
