STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT relating to the fee of the registration of Physicians and Surgeons.

Be it enacted by the Pcople of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 11, chapter 17 of the Revised Statutes

- 2 as amended by chapter 31 of the Public Laws of 1911, is
- 3 hereby further amended by striking out the word "fifteen"
- 4 in the first and second sentences and inserting in place there-
- 5 of the word 'ten,' so that said section as amended shall read
- 6 as follows:

'Sect. 11. Any person shall, upon the payment of a fee 8 of ten dollars, be entitled to examination, and if found 9 qualified by a majority of the members of the board pres10 ent shall be registered as a physician or surgeon, and shall receive a certificate thereof under the seal of the board, and 12 signed by the chairman and secretary, which shall state the 13 facts and must be publicly displayed at the person's princi-14 pal place of business as long as said person continues such 15 practice for gain or hire. Any person refused registration 16 may be re-examined at the regular meeting of said board, 17 within two years of the time of such refusal, without ad-18 ditional fee and thereafter may be examined as often as 19 he may desire upon payment of the fee of ten dollars for 20 each examination. All fees received by the board here-21 under shall be paid by the secretary thereof into the treas-22 ury of the state once each month.'
