Resolved, That the sum of forty-one dollars and sixty cents

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# STATEMENT OF FACTS ACCOMPANYING RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF W. V. PEEBLES.

Mr. Peebles, who keeps a store at Long Pond Plantation, was summoned to Augusta by telephone, by the Chairman of the Committee on Elections, in order to bring before the Committee the ballots cast at the September election, for use by the Committee in determining the contested election between Warren B. Clark and John Metcalf, relative to the seat in the House now occupied by Mr. Clark. Mr. Peebles is the Plantation Clerk of Long Pond.

Of the amount named in the resolve, the sum of sixteen dollars and sixty cents (\$16.60) is for cash disbursements of Mr. Peebles going and returning from Long Pond to Augusta. The remainder is intended as compensation for three days' time away from his business.
