## STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of the adoption of an address to the Governor for the removal of Adelbert J. Tolman, Sheriff for the County of Knox.

Resolved, that both branches of the Legislature, after due 2 notice given, according to the Constitution, will proceed to 3 consider the adoption of an address to the G vernor for the 4 removal of Adelbert J. Tolman, Sheriff for the County of

5 Knox, for the causes as following:

First, because the said Adelbert J. Tolman, who is now 7 holding the office of Sheriff for the County of Knox, and 8 who has held said office continuously since the first day of 9 January A. D., 1913, wilfully or corruptly refuses or ne- 10 glects to perform the duties required of him as such Sher- 11 iff by Section sixty-nine of Chapter twenty-nine of the Re- 12 vised Statutes of this State as amended by Chapter forty-

13 one of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, and 14 particularly his duties as said Sheriff in enforcement of the 15 law against the illegal sale of intoxicating liquors and the 16 keeping of drinking houses and tippling shops.

Resolved, The House of Representatives concurring, that 18 these resolutions and statements of causes of removal be 19 entered on the Journal of the Senate and a copy of the same 20 be signed by the President of the Senate and served on said 21 Adelbert J. Tolman by such person as the President of the 22 Senate shall appoint for that purpose, who shall make re-23 turn of said service upon his personal affidavit without de-24 lay, and that the second day of April at eleven o'clock in the 25 forenoon, be assigned as the time when the said Adelbert J. Tolman may be admitted to a hearing in his defense.
