STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to Provide for the Cutting of Bushes and Weeds
Within the Limits of any Highway or Townway Adjoining
Cultivated Land.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Every owner of cultivated land adjoining any

- 2 highway or townway shall on or before August 15th, of
- 3 each year cut and remove all bushes, weeds, grass or other
- 4 growth (except growing crops, shade trees, timber trees or
- 5 ornamental shrubs) growing between said cultivated land
- 6 and the wrought part of said highway or townway.
 - Sect. 2. If any owner of cultivated land shall fail to cut 2 and remove said bushes, weeds, grass or other growth on

- 3 or before said August 15th, in each year, the mayor of any
- 4 city, the selectmen of any town or the assessors of any plan-
- 5 tation wherein said land may be located shall cause said
- 6 bushes, weeds, grass or other growth to be cut and removed.
- 7 The actual expense of such cutting and removal shall become
- 8 a lien upon said land so adjoining said way and shall be
- 9 assessed and collected as a tax thereon.
 - Sect. 3. For the purposes of this act the term "cultivated
- 2 land" shall include all land from which the grass shall be
- 3 annually cut or any other annual crop taken.
