IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT amendatory of chapter two hundred and sixty-three of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and three relating to the street sewer and permanent improvement department of the City of Lewiston.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section six of chapter two hundred and sixty-  
2 three of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and three is  
3 hereby amended so as to read when amended as follows:

‘Sect. 6. A superintendent of streets and sewers, who  
5 shall have executive charge of work under the direction and  
6 control of the board, shall be elected biennially, by the  
7 legally qualified voters of said city of Lewiston at the elec-

8 tion held on the first Monday of March, and shall hold office  
9 for a term of two years or until his successor is elected.  
10 The first election of a superintendent of streets and sewers  
11 under this act shall be held at the regular annual city elec-  
12 tion held on the first Monday of March, nineteen hundred  
13 and fourteen, and thereafter a superintendent shall be elect-  
14 ed each second year. Said superintendent may contract for  
15 necessary labor and materials, subject at all times to the  
16 approval of the board to whom he shall render an account  
17 monthly, or oftener if required of all receipts, expenditures  
18 and outstanding bills.' .

Sect. 2. Section eight of said chapter two hundred and  
2 sixty-three is hereby amended by striking out the word  
3 "board" in the second line of said section and substituting  
4 therefor the words 'city council,' so that said section, as  
5 amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 8. The compensation of the superintendent of  
7 streets and sewers shall be fixed by the city council and  
8 shall be paid from the appropriation made for the work  
9 of the board.'
