STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to change the burden of proof in certain negligence cases in which contributory negligence is a defense.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. In actions to recover damages for negligently
2 causing the death of a person, or for injury to a person
3 who is deceased at the time of trial of such action, the per4 son for whose death or injury the action is brought shall
5 be presumed to have been in the exercise of due care at
6 the time of all acts in any way related to his death or in7 jury, and if contributory negligence be relied upon as a
8 defense it shall be pleaded and proved by the defendant.
