

STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Wilton Academy.

Resolved, That there be appropriated for the use of the 2 trustees of Wilton Academy the sum of eight hundred and 3 ninety-two dollars and eighty-three cents for the purpose 4 of paying bills previously contracted for repairing and resolved modeling the present school building, the said sum being an 6 undrawn balance of money appropriated under chapter 155 7 of the Resolves of 1911.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Legislature of 1911 appropriated twenty-five hundred dollars for the purpose of completing the repairing and remodeling of the present school building, and for completing the installation of a heating plant.

It was intended that this appropriation should apply also to meet a deficiency then existing. The statement of facts made at that time shows this, and this fact was placed prominently before the committee at the hearing. A clause in the resolve covering this item was inadvertently omitted. The State Auditor approved bills for improvements made in 1911 for sixteen hundred seven dollars and seventeen cents, which amount has been paid to the trustees, leaving a balance of eight hundred ninety-two dollars and eighty-three cents of the appropriation of 1911, which the trustees were unable to draw, and which sum is the amount asked for in this resolve. The present deficiency amounts to more than this balance.
