STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to authorize cities and towns to appropriate money for advertising purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Any city or town may appropriate any sum,

- 2 not exceeding one mill on a dollar, based on the valuation
- 3 of the preceding year, to be used for advertising the natural
- 4 resources, advantages and attractions of such city or town.
