STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to create a lien on wells.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Whoever performs labor or furnishes labor or 2 materials in sinking wells by digging, blasting, boring, or 3 drilling, has a lien on the land appurtenant thereto for ninety 4 days after the date of furnishing such materials, finishing 5 or performing such labor. Such lien shall have precedence 6 of all other claims and of all attachments and encumbrances 7 not made to secure a similar lien and may be enforced by 8 attachment within the time aforesaid.
