### STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to authorize Employment of County Prisoners on Highways.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. County commissioners may authorize the keep-2 ers of jails to put able-bodied male prisoners to work on 3 the building or repairing of highways within their county.
4 The county commissioners shall make rules and regulations 5 and appoint overseers and keepers needful for the direction 6 and safe keeping of prisoners so employed, and such over-7 seers and keepers shall have all authority conferred by stat-8 ute on masters of houses of correction and shall be responsed.

9 sible for the safe keeping and return to jail of all prisoners 10 in their custody, and shall be subject to the provisions of 11 section 57 of chapter 82 of the Revised Statutes. No pris-12 oner shall be so employed who has been exempted therefrom 13 by the magistrate imposing sentence, or if in the judgment 14 of a physician expressed by a certificate he is unfit for such 15 labor. County commissioners shall supply all prisoners so 16 employed with suitable clothing and tools, and shall keep 17 account of all cost incident to such employment.

Sect. 2. The State Highway Department and municipal 2 officers of towns may make application for the services of 3 prisoners as aforesaid and may enter into an agreement as 4 to the cost and compensation to be paid to the county for 5 such services, and the sum so agreed on may be paid out 6 of moneys appropriated for highway purposes. All such 7 labor shall be under the general direction of the board or 8 persons charged with the work.

Sect. 3. On written petition signed by at least three per 2 cent. of the voters in the county, as determined by the num-3 ber of votes cast therein for governor at the last preceding 4 election, addressed to the county commissioners requesting 5 the employment of prisoners as above provided, the com-6 missioners shall act thereon and shall designate prisoners 7 available for work under the conditions provided in this act.
