STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the Aroostook Central Institute.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated for the
2 Aroostook Central Institute at Mars Hill, for the purpose
3 of assisting in the maintenance for the expense of teachers,
4 janitor service and fuel, the sum of three hundred dollars.
5 for the year nineteen hundred and thirteen, and a like sum:
6 for the year nineteen hundred and fourteen.

STATEMENT OF FACT.

So rapid has been the growth of the Aroostook Central Institute that the trustees have much difficulty in obtaining the necessary funds for running the Institute and to make such repairs and improvements on the buildings and grounds as are imperatively needed. The sum asked for in the resolve is of great importance to the Institute at this time.
