R E P O R T.

This committee was appointed in accordance with the following order:

Ordered, that whereas the 75th Legislature has under consideration various measures for the distribution of state school funds, therefore,

Ordered, the Senate concurring, that a special committee of five, consisting of two on the part of the Senate and three on the part of the House, to serve without pay, be appointed to investigate the present and proposed methods of distribution of school funds, and report to the next Legislature by bill or otherwise.

WORK OF THE COMMITTEE.

Several meetings of the committee have been held, among the most important being those at Castine in July, 1912, when opportunity was given to the superintendents of schools to express their views and opinions on the subject under discussion; at the Maine Teachers' Association in Portland in 1912 and at the meeting of the Maine State Grange in the same city in December, 1912. Regular meetings of the committee have been held for the purpose of discussing the various phases of the problem under consideration. The committee has consulted with educational experts of this and other states and has been in consultation with the Chief of the Department of School Administration of the National Bureau of Education. Recourse has also been taken to various state school reports and special reports dealing with the subject submitted to the committee.

At the several hearings, statements have been made to the committee by various persons interested in the matter under discussion. These include superintendents of schools, members of school committees, officials of local and state granges, the bishop of the Catholic Church of the Maine Diocese, and other interested citizens. Stenographic reports were made of nearly all the suggestions submitted while, in other instances, briefs were later submitted to the committee. All of these have been placed on file.

Since each discussion of any change in the method of school fund distribution has at once given rise to a demand for information relative to the details of school appropriation not only for the state but for each of the towns, the committee has caused the compilation of tables covering points that have been raised. These are made a part of this report.

Tables A and B have been compiled for the purpose of presenting certain important facts that relate to school appropriations and school support under present laws. Any discussion of the distribution of school moneys must take into ac-

count variation in local expenditures and the tables mentioned aim to show in compact form the exact situation under present methods. Table A shows the amount available for school support in the various cities and towns of the state and includes every purpose to which the law gives any recognition. Under the first eleven headings of this table, appear the direct appropriations of the several towns. These are reduced under columns 10 and 11 so as to show the per capita application, first on the school census and second on the basis of average attendance. These two columns show conclusively the wide variety in the amount of school funds made available to the schooling of each child. Columns 12-19, inclusive, of Table A show the amounts available to the several towns and cities from state appropriations and apportionments. As in the other columns of this table, these figures include all purposes for which the state makes any appropriation whatever. The reduction of these figures in columns 18-19 to the per capita basis shows for these state appropriations similar deductions to those in columns 10-11 for local appropriations. Columns 20-22 show the total sums available together with the amounts available on the per capita basis, both census and average attendance. These final columns 21 and 22 are especially significant as they show how much is available to each person from both state and local appropriations.

Table B undertakes to show the main facts of school appropriation and expenditure in their application to common schools alone. As in the case of Table A, a division is made between amounts available from local and state funds in order to make possible a ready comparison. The columns which indicate the per capita figures are especially valuable as a means of showing the variation in funds available to the education of each individual pupil.

The last column of Table B shows the per cent of valuation assessed for common schools. It should be understood that

this includes both local assessment and the amount received from the state out of the Common School Fund, which, under the law, is deemed to be raised by towns. The purpose of Table C will be mentioned later.

THE HISTORY OF MAINE STATE SCHOOL FUNDS.

The first enactment of any Maine legislature looking to the establishment of a state school fund was that passed by the legislature of 1828 directing the Land Agent to set apart twenty townships of the public lands to be sold and the proceeds to be deposited in the state treasury to form a permanent state school fund, the interest to be distributed annually among the several towns and plantations in the state according to the number of scholars therein. By a provision of the same law, all moneys received from Massachusetts on account of claims against the United States for services in the war of 1812 were to be set aside for the support of schools. This section relating to war claims was repealed in 1835.

In 1833, there was enacted the first bank tax under the conditions of which, all sums to be thereafter received by the state for the tax on savings banks, with certain minor exceptions, were to be expended for the support of elementary schools. The basis of apportionment of state funds continued to be the number of scholars resident in each of the towns or school districts.

In 1855, the legislature passed a resolve which authorized the Land Agent, under the advice and direction of the governor and council, to set apart a quantity of the public lands, equal to twenty-four half townships, to be reserved and applied for the benefit of common schools and to be held in trust for that purpose only. The resolve provided for the sale of not more than one township each year, the proceeds to be appropriated as a permanent fund for the benefit of common schools, the interest of which fund was to be annually distributed among the

towns according to the number of scholars. In 1857, another resolve directed that twenty per cent of all moneys accruing from the sale of the public lands should be added to the permanent school fund for the benefit of common schools.

Chapter 217 of the Public Laws of 1863 remitted to the banks of the state an amount of their state tax equal to the amount required to be paid to the United States by the law establishing national banks. This remission very considerably reduced the school fund. In 1864 and 1866, the state applied a greater interest in the public lands to the permanent school fund.

The First Mill Tax.—In 1872, by the provisions of Chapter 43 of the Public Laws, the first school mill fund for the support of common schools was created. Under the conditions of this act, a general tax of one mill per dollar was to be annually assessed upon all property of the state and the proceeds paid into the state treasury and designated as the School Mill Fund. The fund thus derived was to be distributed July 1st, annually, to the several cities, towns and plantations on the basis of the number of scholars in each. This act was the first recognition by Maine of the principle that to some extent the property of all the state should be made to yield a revenue to be applied to the education of common school children in whatever part of the state they might reside.

The state school funds yielded in 1874 on account of the mill tax \$224,529.00, on the tax on banks \$131,293.00 and from the interest on school funds \$19,156.00. In the year 1907, the mill tax was increased to a mill and one-half.

The New Common School Fund.—The legislature of 1909 gave considerable attention to various measures the purpose of which was to find some equitable means of levying a state tax on certain wild lands. Out of the discussion of these measures, it was finally decided to levy an additional tax of one and one-half mills on all property of the state for the support of common schools. With the mill and one-half tax already existing, this made available for common schools a fund derived

from the three mill assessment in addition to the income from the bank tax and the permanent school funds previously mentioned. The total revenue from school funds, including the mill tax increased from the total of \$374,978 as stated above in 1874, to a total of \$1,460,261, January 1st, 1912.

Discussion of Methods of Distribution.—From 1828 to 1909, there had been only one recognized basis of distribution of school funds. The act of 1909 mentioned above, doubling the state tax for common schools, was closely connected with the question, then receiving prominent attention, of the taxation of wild lands. It will be recalled that it was decided to levy a general tax in order to escape any question of constitutionality. There immediately arose a discussion as to the propriety of a distribution of this larger income on school census alone. The representatives of some of the cities and large towns which must necessarily contribute to such a general tax and which could not profit by the distribution on the census plan argued that the new mill tax was levied for the purpose of procuring revenue from wild lands and that the distribution on the census basis alone would not only divert this new revenue to a portion of the towns of the state but would even make an additional levy upon the larger and wealthier towns which would likewise be diverted from the support of their own schools to the support of those located elsewhere. Referring to the original principle on which the first mill tax was levied, others maintained that regardless of the motive for assessing the tax, the fund, after its creation, ought to be devoted exclusively to the purpose of education wherever the children to be educated might reside. This discussion continued through the presentation of several bills to the legislature of 1911. None of these received passage but the plans proposed by them have received the attention of this committee. The results of these plans are approximately given in Table C accompanying this report.

METHODS OF DISTRIBUTION, HITHERTO RECOGNIZED.

School Census.—Under the school census plan, an annual enumeration of all persons between certain ages is made by the superintendent of schools and the total fund is divided by the number of such persons found in the state. A return is then made to each town, city or plantation on the basis of its own enumeration. The theory of the census method is that distribution according to it will place in the hands of the school officers of each town a certain definite sum of money to be applied to the education of each person who is entitled to school privileges. The ages recognized under such distribution in Maine are from five to twenty-one years. The assumption is that the census method of distribution will aid persons between these ages who are eligible to school privileges. It should be borne in mind that at the time of the adoption of this plan (1828) there were no manufacturing centers and there were no private or parochial schools. The distribution of youthful population was doubtless in a more uniform ratio to public school attendance than at the present time.

Valuation Principle Introduced.—The valuation principle was introduced (1909) as a factor in school fund distribution in order to insure to each city and town the return of a certain established proportion of the contribution each would be compelled to make to the state fund if any advantage was to be derived from wild land taxation. The principle was applied as a part of a taxation measure and not fundamentally as an educational one.

Equalization Principle.—In analyzing the school returns from the various towns of the state, it has been found that there is a wide discrepancy in the local tax rate necessary for school support. The small town with low valuation and scattered population has been found to have the highest school tax rate and often the lowest standard of school efficiency. Many of the larger towns also are compelled, because of local economic con-

ditions, to assess themselves for schools much in excess of the average rate for the state and, even then, are unable to maintain their schools on the same standard as towns of greater wealth or fewer scholars. Out of the study of these conditions came the enactment of the first bill creating an equalization fund in 1909. This act set aside \$20,000 of common school funds to be distributed in a certain fixed proportion to all towns assessing themselves in excess of the average rate for the state. In 1911, the law creating this fund was amended by increasing the amount to \$27,500 and by providing for the distribution to the same class of towns as before but for certain specified purposes to be recommended by the state superintendent.

This fund has brought a degree of relief and assistance to a very large number of the poorer towns and has been an important factor in removing some of the more marked inequalities of distribution.

This equalization fund tends to correct discrepancies that exist at the lower end of the scale. It does not, of course, overcome those difficulties that arise from a too generous allotment of state funds. The cases where the present method of apportionment yields an excess of funds are not numerous. There are a few, however, where state apportionments are so large in proportion to local school expense that no local appropriations are necessary; while in a very few instances, the state apportionment appears to yield so large a return that its wise expenditure becomes difficult. The present law requires that towns shall carry forward from year to year any unexpended balances of common school funds. This requirement does not apply to cities. In a few cities where the state apportionment is high and the local school expense is low, there is a constant liability that state school funds may be indirectly applied to other than common school expenses since a balance on hand at the end of the year may be charged off and, the following year, reappropriated for another purpose. While the cases where

this is likely to occur are very few it appears clear that such diversions are contrary to the intention of the common school fund and that they should not be permitted by law.

The foregoing three bases of distribution, namely, school census recognized from 1828 to the present time, and valuation and equalization introduced in 1909, are the only ones thus far recognized in Maine in the general distribution of funds by the state to the towns and cities.

Appropriations Deducted from School Funds.—There have, however, been certain well established practices of the legislature relative to deductions from the state school fund of certain appropriations whose purpose was held to be to increase the efficiency of the common schools. It would appear that this practice has been so well established that up to the present time, no appropriations have been so deducted unless they could be defended as likely to contribute directly, or indirectly, to the betterment of the common schools. For example, with the establishment of state normal schools whose aim was to create a better grade of teachers for the elementary schools of the state, it was evidently held to be just and proper to provide for their support out of this general common school fund. Similar deductions have been made from time to time to cover the expense of state examination of teachers, teachers' institutes, summer training schools and special appropriations to academies offering normal training courses.

Likewise, upon the passage of an act to provide common school privileges for children in unorganized townships, it was provided that the expense of furnishing such privileges should be met from the state common school funds.

Still later, the previously mentioned equalization fund, aimed to increase the efficiency of common schools in poorer towns, was so deducted and the same principle was held to apply to the industrial education act, whose purpose was to encourage industrial education in all classes of schools, and to

expert supervision as provided in the special enactment empowering towns to join in employing superintendents of schools.

State Appropriations for Schools, Outside of Common School Funds.—It should be understood, of course, that the amounts distributed to common schools do not include all the appropriations made by the state for the support of education. In addition to the amounts paid to towns for the support of their common schools from the sources previously mentioned, the state has from time to time made other liberal contributions to education. By the provision of the constitution which states that the legislature shall give encouragement to educational institutions, there have been numerous special appropriations to institutes, seminaries, academies and colleges. For many years, these appropriations were made through special resolves.

In 1901, the legislature passed a general academy act with the purpose of defining the exact conditions under which any academy, institute or seminary might expect to receive state aid. No doubt the intention was to prevent or discourage the special appropriations which the absence of such a general enactment tended to encourage. The amount required annually to meet the obligations incurred under this general academy act is approximately twenty-five thousand dollars.

In 1873, an act was passed to establish free high schools. Under various enactments the towns have received grants ranging from two hundred and fifty dollars to five hundred dollars annually in accordance with the specific statute in force at the time. The cost to the state for the encouragement of high schools and for the payment of secondary school tuition of students who live in towns that do not support such institutions at present amounts approximately to one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars annually. It will thus be seen that the state expends annually about one hundred and fifty thousand dollars for secondary schools in addition to what is expended for elementary schools.

Moreover, it should be stated that the general academy law has not prevented the introduction of special grants to institutions of the academy class. While such institutions do not often seek special appropriations for maintenance, they do occasionally ask state aid for construction purposes.

A statement relative to the different conditions which apply to high schools and academies will be of interest. A town maintaining a public high school having met certain requirements may draw a sum not to exceed five hundred dollars. An academy that meets certain requirements as to courses, attendance and maintenance, may draw an amount ranging from five hundred dollars to one thousand dollars annually. Both high schools and academies are entitled to the same additional grants when they offer courses as prescribed in the industrial education act. It will, therefore, be seen that a school operating under an academy charter may, under some conditions, receive much more direct state aid than a public high school may receive under any conditions. Moreover, additional indirect state aid may come to an academy when the town makes a contract with it, and turns over to the academy its own aid received from the state under the terms of the contract law.

While these grants to secondary education have not been made from the common school funds, the committee believes it desirable to call attention to the facts connected with them and to state its conviction that such grants whenever they are made should under no circumstances be deducted from any amount raised and appropriated by the state for common schools.

School Funds and their Distribution in Other States.--A consideration of the problem of the distribution of school funds in Maine has led your committee to make a careful examination of the methods of distribution of school funds in other states. This examination discloses the fact that there is no uniformity whatever as to the sources from which such state funds are drawn. Nearly all the states have some permanent school funds

derived from the sale of lands. The funds so derived are largest in the western and newer states. Nearly all the states have adopted some means of increasing these permanent school funds by direct taxation or by revenues from special sources. The variety is so great as to make impossible any valuable comparison between any two states.

At the date of the committee's investigation, there was no other state deriving from taxation so large a proportion of state funds as Maine and in very few states are schools supported in so small a degree by funds obtained from direct local taxes. In other words, Maine appears to have gone very much farther than most states in accepting the state as the educational unit in school support.

With respect to the method of distributing state funds, a still wider variety of practice obtains. This variety is no doubt due in large measure to the difference in the manner of the collection of the funds. We do find that there are various principles adopted in whole or in part by different states. Probably the census method is more generally recognized than any other. Some states base the apportionment in part upon the average, others on the aggregate attendance. A very few give some recognition to the number of schools maintained, while a few others, of which Maine is one, recognize valuation as a proper basis to be included in part. The only note of agreement that the committee finds is that whatever basis is adopted none can be found which will absolutely equalize inequalities among the several communities of the state. For example, the cost of maintaining a small school must on a per capita basis exceed that of a large school. Overhead charges decrease per capita in proportion to the increase of concentrated population. These and other conditions cannot be regulated by statute. The best testimony your committee has been able to secure after consulting with the educational authorities of this and other states and under the advice of the experts of the National Bureau of

Education is to the effect that every state should establish some form of equalization fund to be devoted to overcoming such inequalities as must result from any general statute.

A DISCUSSION OF PROPOSED METHODS.

Under Table C which accompanies this report will be found an outlined statement of the approximate results of several methods that have been under the consideration of the committee.

The state fund distributed January 1st, 1912, is taken as a basis for these figures. The school census, attendance and valuation in force for the distribution of 1912 were used in making the deductions of this table. It is, of course, understood that the amount of each distribution will fluctuate as the school census, attendance and valuation of the towns are not constant figures. The table has been compiled with the intention of giving certain *approximate* estimates of the benefits of the various proposed methods to each of the cities, towns and plantations of the state. A brief statement of the principle involved in each of the proposed methods may be given.

Straight Census Method.—The twelfth column of Table C shows the approximate results of a method of apportionment which would eliminate the valuation feature entirely and continue as the sole basis the census plan which, as already stated, was the only one recognized in Maine prior to 1909.

When the school census plan was adopted in 1828, it doubtless furnished a reasonably just method of distribution since at that time the ratio of public school attendance to the number of scholars did not probably vary to a great extent throughout the state. It is doubtless true that for the majority of the towns the plan continues to be reasonably fair. An analysis of the figures shows conclusively, however, that there are cities and towns whose schools can be maintained almost wholly from state funds because of the fact that these municipalities are

relieved from the cost of educating large numbers of persons enumerated as scholars, but actually to be found employed in mills and factories or in attendance at schools that cost the towns nothing to support.

Average Attendance Method.—The fourth column shows the result of a method of distribution which will take the average attendance in common schools as a basis of apportionment. The theory is held that such a method of apportionment would place the state funds in the hands of the municipalities in the proportion that children were in attendance in common schools. Objections that have been raised to this method of apportionment are that it does not give proper consideration to those communities that are called on to provide for a considerable number of educational activities outside of common schools and that due credit is not given to the burdens assumed by towns which hold their schools in session for a number of weeks beyond the average for the state.

Method of Apportionment Giving Average Attendance in All Schools.—The eighth column of Table C indicates the results of a proposed method which would give credit for average attendance in all classes of schools including not only common schools and other public schools, but private and parochial schools as well. This method was proposed by those who maintain that a community which keeps in school a large proportion of its children should have credit and state recognition therefor even though the enrollment does not appear in public elementary schools. The objectors raise the point that this method of apportionment returns the common school funds to a town so that state funds are applied to the support of common school facilities when, as a matter of fact, many of the persons for whom the per capita return is made are actually in attendance in schools that cost their towns nothing to support, or in schools that are outside the grade of those contemplated by a common school fund.

Proposed Method of Apportionment on the Basis of Aggregate Attendance in Common Schools.—The tenth column of Table C indicates the approximate result of a method of apportionment which makes use of aggregate attendance as a basis. By aggregate attendance is meant the total result of all days of attendance of all pupils in the schools. For example, a child in attendance for the five school days of the week would count for five days of aggregate attendance. On the basis of a school year of thirty weeks, perfect attendance of any child would count for one hundred and fifty days aggregate attendance. This method recognizes actual school attendance in common schools and does not permit any credit to a town on account of school funds for any day that a child is absent from school.

This method theoretically makes an actual application of some portion of the school fund to the education of a child for every day he is actually in school. Waiving for the moment the question of the sources from which funds are derived and assuming that no credit should be given to a town for other than public elementary school attendance, the method appears to be a just one. Objectors to it point out the difficulty of securing accurate returns of school attendance as a chief obstacle to the successful working of the plan. Others, as in the case of the average attendance method, believe that towns should be given some credit for those children who are to be found in other than public elementary schools. Again it is pointed out that this method in common with all save the one now in force does not recognize certain extraordinary municipal expenses that must be incurred in large centers and that are not necessary in rural towns.

Direct Application to Towns of Different Types.—A few cases are hereinafter cited with a view to furnishing examples of the several plans. Lewiston is an example of the community which shows a wide variety in results and it will be observed that the straight census method yields the greatest return of

state funds. A slightly smaller return is shown by the present method while the proposed method of giving credit for attendance in all schools shows a loss to Lewiston of approximately \$8,000, which sum, it is to be inferred, indicates a distribution otherwise made for persons not in school. Using aggregate attendance in common schools, there is a sharp decline showing a loss of more than \$30,000 over the present method. This loss, of course, results from a proportionately large attendance of Lewiston children in other than public schools. Again, using the proposed method of average attendance in common schools only, a further loss of \$3,000 would accrue to Lewiston. From this case, it appears that any city or town that has a large private school enrollment and a large proportion of youthful workers in the industries will be disadvantageously effected in its state school funds by any change from the school census or the combined census and valuation plan.

An important consideration that has been raised in every discussion of this question is that of the amount contributed by the city or town under the mill tax to the state school fund. While discussing the case of Lewiston, therefore, it should be stated that on the basis of valuation of that city there was contributed to the general state fund for the year 1912 the sum of \$50,583. The present method of apportionment returns to the city \$59,871; the straight census method \$59,916; the average attendance, common schools only, \$26,043; average attendance all schools \$50,472; and the aggregate attendance, common schools only, \$29,432.

Auburn is a city which represents another type of community where the valuation is relatively somewhat lower and where the private school enrollment and youthful employment are smaller. The relatively slight variation in the figures for Auburn indicates that on all essential points of school attendance and school support conditions must nearly approximate the general average for the state. It will be seen that the

widest variation by the several plans for that city is approximately \$4,000 and, barring the proposed method for average attendance in common schools, the variation would in no case exceed \$1,000. Auburn contributed through the three mill tax, the sum of \$25,195 to the state school fund. It would receive according to the approximations of Table C by the several methods as follows: Present method \$31,248; average attendance in common schools only \$27,817; average attendance in all schools \$31,935; aggregate attendance in common schools \$30,673; straight census method \$31,910.

Albion is a type of rural community where the valuation is not large and where the per capita cost of education is likely to be considerable because of the distribution of children among smaller schools. A town of this kind does not maintain a school year of the same length as the larger towns and cities. It will be observed, therefore, that the plan most favorable to a town of this kind is that which gives average attendance in common schools only. By this plan, Albion would receive \$1,849 as against \$1,787 on the basis of aggregate attendance. \$1,752 on the basis of attendance in all schools, \$1,744 on a straight census plan and \$1,612, or the smallest amount, on the present method. Albion contributed to the state school fund in 1912 \$1,113 on the three mill tax. By the operation of the equalization act, Albion received \$99.44.

Cape Elizabeth may be taken as an example of the small town which has a large valuation on account of the development of summer resorts. Towns of this class distinctly gain by the present method as will be seen by the figures for Cape Elizabeth which receives \$2,893 on the present plan as against \$2,077 on the straight census plan. \$1,598 by aggregate attendance plan, \$1,503 counting average attendance in common schools only and \$1,452 employing average attendance in all schools as a basis. The assessment made in Cape Elizabeth for the state school fund amounted to \$3,989.

Portland as the largest city of the state reflects in a striking manner the results of the various plans in their effect on local school support. Portland contributed to the state school fund through the three mill tax in 1912 \$192,532. It receives in return the largest amount under the present combined census and valuation plan which yields \$145,597. \$112,846 would be returned by the aggregate attendance method, \$111,281 on the straight census plan and only \$102,339 by a method using average attendance in common schools as the basis. It will be seen, therefore, that Portland contributes to the common school education of children in other cities and towns by the present method \$46,935 and would contribute the relatively larger sums by any of the other methods.

This variation in amounts to be contributed by some towns to the education of children living elsewhere together with the excess contributions received by some can be followed out for any town of the state by the use of the figures given in Table C and by taking three mills of the 1911 valuation of the town as the amount directly contributed to the state school funds through taxation.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE.

Believing that a divided report of the committee would have little value to the legislature, the members of the committee agreed to report only those recommendations to which every member could give his individual assent. Proceeding from this agreement, the committee finds itself unable to report in favor of any change in the fundamental method of distribution to be adopted in the immediate future. The committee would recommend that the method already employed since 1909 be continued for the present and it would state the following reasons for this recommendation.

(a) That it believes that the principle of the present method of distribution is not clearly and fully understood by a major-

ity of the people and that it is desirable that it should continue in force long enough for the people to understand its provisions more fully before any change should be undertaken.

(b) That the results of the method, as well as the principles underlying it, have not yet been fully realized in practice and that it is desirable that more time be taken for the understanding of its results before any change is made.

(c) That for the two reasons already stated there is no consensus of opinion, even among those who advocate a change, as to what the nature of the change should be.

(d) Since a motive involved in the assessment of the last mill and one-half tax (common school fund) was to procure income to the state from the wild lands, that this motive should not be disregarded in any discussion relative to the present distribution of the funds so procured.

Supplementary Recommendations.—The committee would make the following supplementary recommendations which it should be understood are based upon and connected with the foregoing general recommendation and are not to be connected with any of those points under the general propositions which are hereinafter stated with a view to furnishing a basis of future discussion.

1. It recommends that the state school report shall annually include one table which shall show the distribution of school funds to each town together with the assessment made upon each town under the provisions of the mill tax laws.

2. It recommends that the equalization principle be continued and that the fund appropriated for this purpose be increased to \$50,000.00.

3. It recommends that the appropriation for union superintendence be made as a separate appropriation and that it be no longer deducted from common school funds.

4. It recommends that the state require of the towns and cities a more adequate and accurate accounting of all school

expenditures, particularly those made from state funds. That this purpose may be carried out, the state superintendent should be authorized to furnish to local officers proper forms and books for keeping all school records and accounts and the governor and council should be authorized to order an audit of the school accounts of any city or town whenever such an audit may appear to them to be necessary.

5. It recommends, if special appropriations are made for academies or other higher institutions, that these shall not be deducted from common school funds.

6. It recommends that state appropriations for the encouragement of free high schools shall not be deducted from common school funds.

7. It recommends that the law be so amended as to prevent cities as well as towns from diverting any portion of common school funds to any other purpose than the support of common schools. Such an amendment should provide for a return to the state school fund of any amount not required by the city or town for the maintenance of its common schools.

General Propositions.—While the committee recommends that no change in the general method of distribution be for the present adopted, it is agreed that the following propositions should be given careful consideration in any future proposals that may be made to change the basis of distribution. It should be understood that these propositions are entirely distinct from the foregoing recommendations. The principles of the recommendations foregoing depend upon the continuance of the present plan and are not necessarily to be connected with any of the following propositions.

(a) Regarding the state school fund solely as an educational fund, the valuation basis is indefensible.

(b) Of the proposed methods, the school census plan would be least likely to remove existing inequalities and is hence the least desirable.

(c) Any change affecting the general distribution should not be effective immediately upon the enactment of the law. Ample time should be given to allow the towns and cities to make such changes in local appropriations as the alteration of the method of distribution of state funds might require.

(d) The plan of aggregate attendance including all schools and eliminating special aid to secondary schools for any purpose whatever is one that should invite the careful future consideration of the people.
