STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of the purchase of "Directions and Forms for Criminal Procedure in Maine."

Resolved, That the secretary of state be authorized to con-2 tract for one hundred and fifty copies of "Directions and 3 Forms for Criminal Procedure in Maine," published by 4 Loring, Short & Harmon, of Portland, Maine, at a cost of 5 three dollars (\$3.00) per copy, and that the sum of four 6 hundred and fifty dollars (\$450.00) be and hereby is appro-7 priated for that purpose. Two copies of said book are to 8 be delivered to the state librarian for the use of the state 9 library and the balance distributed among the county attor-10 neys, judges of police courts, trial justices, commissioners of 11 sea and shore fisheries, and their wardens, commissioners 12 of inland fisheries and game and their wardens, and agents 13 for the prevention of cruelty to animals, in the state of 14 Maine; the same to remain the property of the state of 15 Maine and to be used for official purposes by said officials 16 and their successors in office.
