STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section eighty and Section eighty-one of Chapter fifty-two of the Revised Statutes relating to provisions for safety in the management and operation of steam railroads.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Section eighty of chapter fifty-two of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the
word "manner" in the first line the words 'or drinks intox4 icating liquors as a beverage,' so that the said section as
5 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 80. Whoever behaves in a disorderly or riotous 7 manner or drinks intoxicating liquors as a beverage, while 8 on any train of railroad cars, street railroad car, steamboat 9 or ferry, or uses indecent or profane language in such car, 10 steamboat or ferry, is guilty of a breach of the peace and 11 shall be fined not less than five, nor more than five hundred 12 dollars, or imprisoned in jail not less than thirty days nor 13 more than one year, in addition to any other penalty pro-14 vided by law.'

Sect. 2. Section eighty-one of chapter fifty-two of the 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding after the 3 word "ferry" in the second line the words 'shall have the 4 right to refuse to permit any person not in the custody of 5 an officer, to enter any passenger car on his train or street 6 car in his charge or steamboat or ferry in his charge, who 7 shall be in a state of intoxication; and shall have the fur-8 ther right to eject from his train at any station or from his 9 street car, steamboat or ferry at any regular stop any per-10 son found in a state of intoxication or drinking intoxicating 11 liquors as a beverage on any passenger car of his train or 12 any street car under his charge, or any steamboat or ferry 13 under his charge and for that purpose may call to his aid 14 any employee of the railroad, street car, steamboat or ferry 15 company, and,' and is further amended by substituting the 16 word 'any' for the words "such a" in the third line after 17 the words "guilty of," and by adding after the word "peace" 18 in the third line the words, 'mentioned in section eighty of 19 this chapter,' so that said section as amended shall read as 20 follows:

'Sect. 81. The conductor of a train of cars on any railroad 22 or of a street railroad car, or the officer in charge of any 23 steamboat or ferry, shall have the right to refuse to permit 24 any person not in the custody of an officer, to enter any 25 passenger car on his train or street car in his charge or 26 steamboat or ferry in his charge, who shall be in a state 27 of intoxication; and shall have the further right to ejecu 28 from his train at any station or from his street car, steam-29 boat or ferry at any regular stop any person found in a state 30 of intoxication or drinking intoxicating liquors as a bever-31 age on any passenger car of his train or any street car 32 under his charge, or any steamboat or ferry under his charge, 33 and for that purpose may call to his aid any employee of 34 the railroad, street car, steamboat or ferry company, and 35 may arrest and temporarily hold any person guilty of any 36 breach of the peace mentioned in section eighty of this chap-37 ter until a warrant can be obtained or he can be placed in 38 the custody of the proper officers of the law.'
