STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to change the shire town of Alfred in York County
to the City of Saco.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. From and after the first day of January, in the
2 year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, the
3 City of Saco shall be the shire town of York County.

Sect. 2. Before the first day of January, in the year of
2 our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, the county
3 commissioners of said county of York, or a majority of them,
4 are authorized, empowered, directed and required to pur-
5 chase a lot or lots and cause to be erected at said Saco, build-

ings suitable for a court house, county offices and a jail for the use of said county, and to procure a loan of money for the purpose, and assess taxes for the same in such amounts as at such times as in their judgment shall be most advantageous to the interest of said county.

Sect. 3. The county commissioners shall forthwith, after said buildings as are specified in section two of this act have been provided, cause the records in all the county offices, including the registry of deeds, registry of probate, the records of the county commissioners, and the records and files of all the courts which now are or have been held in said county, to be removed to the place prepared for them at said Saco, and said commissioners shall cause notice of the fact that suitable buildings have been provided, as provided in section two of this act, and of the removal of the records aforesaid by publication in all the public newspapers printed in said county, also in the state paper, and to be continued in all the daily and weekly issues of each of said papers for three weeks successively thereafter.

Sect. 4. The several terms of the supreme judicial court which are now required to be holden at Alfred and at Saco for the county of York, shall after the first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, be holden at Saco, and all writs, processes of any kind, and all proceedings commenced prior to that date and returnable to the January, nineteen hundred and fifteen term of said court, shall be made returnable to the January, in the

9 year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen term
10 of said court at Saco, and be entered and have day and be re-
11 turned in said court at said Saco.

Sect. 5. All terms of the probate court which are not held
2 in Alfred, Biddeford and Saco shall, after the first day of
3 January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred
4 and fifteen, be held in said Saco.
