### STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE in favor of Stock Breeding Associations.

To the Honorable Members of the Legislature:

Gentlemen:

In order that the live stock interests of the State may be benefited and improved and that the Breeders' Association may be aided and encouraged in the work of raising and breeding pure-bred and high grade stock,

Be it resolved:

Sect. 1. That a sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) 2 be raised and appropriated and placed at the disposal of 3 the Commissioner of Agriculture to be used in the manner 4 and for the purpose hereinafter stated.

#### SENATE-No. 166.

Sect. 2. Upon application to the Commissioner of Agri-2 culture by the executive committee of any breeder's asso-3 ciation, said association shall receive the sum of five hun-4 dred dollars (\$500.00) providing, however, that the asso-5 ciation shall have previously raised a like sum of five hun-6 dred dollars among its members.

Sect. 3. The money thus obtained shall be used by the 2 association with the aid of the Commissioner of Agricul-3 ture for the purchase of pure-bred males to be used exclu-4 sively by the association members within its own limits.

Sect. 4. All animals thus purchased shall be the property 2 of the association making the purchase, and shall be taken 3 care of and handled in such manner as the association may 4 determine.
