IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to Extend the Powers of the Limerick Water and Electric Company.

Bc it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The Limerick Water and Electric Company, a 2 corporation created and existing by virtue of Chapter one 3 hundred and fifty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of 4 1907, as amended by chapter one hundred and seventeen of 5 the Private and Special Laws of 1909, is hereby authorized 6 and empowered to exercise and enjoy all of its corporate 7 rights, powers and privileges, in the towns of Parsonsfield 8 and Cornish in the County of York, Porter and Hiram in

9 the County of Oxford and Baldwin in the County of Cum-10 berland, in addition to the towns named in its said act of 11 incorporation and the act amendatory thereof; provided, 12 however, that the said corporation shall not make, sell, dis-13 tribute or supply gas or electricity in or to any of the said 14 towns wherein any other corporation is engaged in the said 15 business, or is authorized to engage in the business of mak-16 ing, selling or distributing gas or electricity, without the con-17 sent of such other corporation.
