### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section nine of Special Laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-three, relating to the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Section nine of the Special Laws of eighteen
hundred and sixty-three, relating to the city of Portland,
sis hereby amended by adding after the last word in the thirteenth sentence thereof the following words: 'Provided that
if any street or way is not constructed within two years
after the laying out of such street or way the proceedings
are void.' So that said sentence as amended shall read as

'The city shall not be compelled to construct or open any street or way thus established hereunder, until in the opinion of the city council the public good requires it to be done; nor shall the city interfere with the possession of the land so taken by removing therefrom materials or otherwise, until they decide to open and construct said streets; projected that if any street or way is not constructed within two years after the laying out the proceedings are void.'
