STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTEEN.

AN ACT to amend Section thirty of Chapter fifty-one of the Revised Statutes, as amended by Chapter one hundred twenty-seven of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, as amended by Chapter ninety-two of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, relating to Railroad Branch Tracks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section thirty of chapter fifty-one of the re-2 vised statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred and twen-3 ty-seven of the public laws of nineteen hundred and five, as 4 amended by chapter ninety-two of the public laws of nine-5 teen hundred and seven, is hereby further amended by in-6 serting after the word "yard" in the fifth line of said sec-7 tion as amended, the words 'educational institutions,' so that 8 said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 30. Any railroad corporation, under the direction of the railroad commissioners, may locate, construct and maintain branch railroad tracks to any railroad station of another corporation or to connect with another railroad or any mills, mines, quarries, gravel pits, log landing or yard, educational institution, or manufacturing establishments erected in any town or township, through which the main line of said railroad is constructed, but not within any city without the consent of the city council and for that purpose said corporation shall have all the powers and rights granted and be subject to all the duties imposed upon it by its character."

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
